VETERANS BURIAL SITES BEFORE 1997

Searching for the burial location of a veteran? Visit the United States Department of Veterans Affairs at gravelocator.cem.va.gov/j2ee/servlet/NGL_v1 At this website you may **search for burial locations of veterans** and their family members in VA National Cemeteries, state veterans cemeteries, various other military and Department of Interior cemeteries, and for veterans buried in private cemeteries when the grave is marked with a government grave marker. The Nationwide Gravesite Locator includes burial records from many sources. These sources provide varied data. Information on veterans buried in private cemeteries was collected for the purpose of furnishing government grave markers, and the United States of Veteran Affairs does not have information available for burials prior to 1997.
